Audience: The primary audience is made up of groups of primary (5-11 years) and/or secondary school-aged (11-16 years) children, accompanied by their teachers/support staff. Also in attendance will be home educators or home school groups along with their Parents, as well as a small number of adults including speakers and Born Free staff. Each webinar will be aimed at different age ranges or school cohorts, including on some occasions students in college or sixth firm (16-18 years), but this will be made clear on the registration page. In addition, as these are publicly advertised events members of the public may also attend.

At least one member of Born Free staff will always be present to monitor the contents of the chatbox/ Q+A box. Born Free staff will always remind attendees to be kind and thoughtful and mindful of the target audience when posting in the chatbox/ Q+A box at the beginning of each webinar. Teachers/parents are requested to supervise and take responsibility for their students/ children, including their removal from the discussion (as appropriate). Born Free suggests that secondary school audiences join webinars as a class, rather than via individual laptops. If an incident occurs and a student posts offensive or disruptive content they will be removed from the webinar immediately, a record will be made and the school/parent of the disruptive student will be contacted. In the event that a member of the public joining the webinar posts offensive or disruptive content they will be removed from the webinar immediately and wherever possible blocked from all future webinars.
